

MARLEY WATERPROOFING DONATES TO BIRD RESCUE CENTRE

Work has started on a new bird hospital at Many Hoots Owl Rescue Centre which will care for species from around the world. The new 64ft outbuilding near Dover is being supported by Marley Waterproofing, which has donated waterproofing materials.

Many Hoots Owl Rescue Centre was launched by animal enthusiast Dave "Tiny" Riches in 1993 and to provide a place of recuperation for British, foreign and migrating birds. Once they have been treated and if they are fit enough, they are returned to their life in the wild. The new outbuilding will be completed this year and replaces a crumbling structure which was originally designed for bee keeping.

Dave said; "The new outbuilding will mean that more birds can be treated each year at Many Hoots. We are really grateful to Marley Waterproofing for the donation of materials because it was becoming difficult to find the finances to complete this project, especially as we don't receive any external Government funding. The outbuilding will also include a classroom so that people of all ages can learn more about birds and how to care for them."

Beth Barber, Marketing Manager at Marley Waterproofing said; "Many Hoots is a local charity so we were very pleased to be able to help. Tiny and his team do a great job looking after a whole variety of birds with very little resource. On a recent visit we enjoyed meeting an African Black Vulture called Lurch, who was rescued two and a half years ago."
